The Organisation

Essex and Suffolk Rivers Trust (ESRT) is an environmental charity set up in 2013 dedicated to improving and protecting rivers in Essex and Suffolk, making them a better place for people and wildlife.

We are one of 65 member Rivers Trusts across Britain, Northern Ireland, and Ireland that sit under the umbrella of the national <u>Rivers Trust</u> - although legally we are an independent organisation. We are the only group of environmental charities in the UK and Ireland dedicated to protecting and improving river environments for the benefit of people and wildlife.

Our Vision

Rivers are the veins that feed our farmland and wildlife habitats and provide water for domestic and industrial use. They are hugely important for wildlife and people and yet many are in a poor state due to pollution, over-abstraction, modification, habitat loss and management neglect.

Essex and Suffolk Rivers Trust wants to do something about this and over the next 20 years we will work with partners, landowners, farmers, and local communities to bring about significant improvements. Following a catchment-based approach we want to see:

- Water quality improved and more places for safe bathing,

- Innovative adaptation and mitigation approaches to tackling impacts from climate change,

Job Description

Post title: Volunteer and Community Involvement Officer

Function: To plan, prepare and lead delivery of volunteering, initially corporate volunteering and citizen science volunteering in Essex.

Reporting to: Bluespaces Delivery Manager

Responsible for: Volunteers, corporate volunteer partners.

Employment Terms

Term: 24-month initial term (with potential to extend subject to funding). Start date on the $w/c 19^{th}$ May, with flexibility.

Hours: Full time (37.5 hours per week). Part time hours considered.

Salary: £28,466 p.a. Grade 3, Band 1.

Pension: NEST pension scheme

Holidays: 25 days plus statutory holidays

Place of work: Hybrid home and office working with travel throughout Essex.

Working Relationships

Internal: ESRT Director, Bluespaces Delivery Manager, Project Support Officer and the Operations Support Officer

External: A wide range of corporate partners, and landowners, including Combined Essex Catchment Partnership members, the Rivers Trust network, Environment Agency, Water Companies, Local Authorities, Natural England, AONBs, project funders, farmers and landowners, other NGOs and local interest groups and communities.

Purpose of Post

Book, plan, prepare and lead high quality volunteering events and activities in Essex, ensuring participants have an enjoyable and safe experience. Working with the Bluespaces Delivery Manager, the Project Support Officer and other ESRT staff to deliver effective engagement and communications with volunteers, corporate volunteers and citizen scientists.

Main Responsibilities

Volunteer Management

- Manage volunteer engagement and events at the Essex and Suffolk Rivers trust, largely focusing on engagement, quarterly newsletters, celebration events, water quality training for our citizen scientists in the Essex RiverWatch initiative and promoting Anglian Waters Cleanup the Roach initiative.
- 2. Book, plan, prepare for and lead events to keep current citizen scientists engaged and abreast of the impact their data collection has on rivers (e.g. webinars, celebration events).
- 3. Work with partners to recruit new citizen scientists and build this catchment wide programme, with scope to expand the programme into Suffolk.
- 4. Engage local communities in our projects and work, including supporting ESRT staff to facilitate community co-creation of projects.
- 5. Book, plan, prepare and lead high quality corporate volunteering events and activities ensuring participants have an enjoyable and safe experience and learn about the river environment. This includes scheduling the activity, conducting pre-event visits and risk assessments, preparing equipment, loading and unloading equipment, event set-up and break-down, cleaning, sorting and maintaining equipment post-event.

- 6. Build relationships with corporate clients and carryout outreach for potential clients, including generating communications that promote corporate volunteering, highlighting stories, successes and photos from events to share.
- 7. Find new activities and locations for corporate volunteering events and maintain good communication with relevant event site contacts to ensure ongoing access to site and any necessary equipment for corporate volunteering activities. This may include liaising with river landowners and stakeholders on permissions and waste clearance.
- 8. Record and monitor engagement and the impact of these events, striving to improve our reach and impact and sharing media back to the client after their event.
- 9. Develop our Corporate Volunteering strategy to ensure role legacy.

General Duties

- 1. Uphold the values and ethos of ESRT and represent the organisation as and when required in a range of settings.
- 2. Manage individual workload and make day to day decisions as to where best to allocate your time, to satisfy the requirements of your work programme.
- 3. Ensure that ESRT policies and procedures, including Health and Safety, are always understood, and adhered to.
- 4. Working with other staff, assist with the general marketing and promotion of ESRT and its work.
- 5. You may be required to carry out other duties and tasks as required from time to time for the efficient operation of the Trust.
